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Summary Highlights for October – November 2019

Notable achievements October – November

- ✓ At the HCH Symposium in Hamilton on 19th November there were 4 CCDHB HCH presentations, including Community Integration
- ✓ One other practice achieved HCH Certification, total now 17 practices with HCH Certification
- ✓ All Tranche 3 HCH practices now have completed Clinical Meet and Greets and have MDTs set up.
- ✓ The HCH Overall Evaluation has commenced which has included interviews with four case study sites and their enrolled population being completed before the end of the year.
- ✓ The cumulative data related to the Kapiti CARs has demonstrated an impact of ED presentations over winter. This was included in a successful presentation to the Kapiti Health Advisory Group on the project that was developed in partnership with them. At the end of Oct there were 110 CARS claims.
- ✓ The Sex & Gender Diverse Working Group hosted a successful community meeting at the Newtown Community Centre to share the group's achievements and share information on access to Gender Affirming Healthcare through CCDHB and other community supports.
- ✓ The Allied Health led early supported discharge (Advancing Wellbeing at Home Initiative- AWHI) pilot was relaunched in mid-October. Since commencing the service they have supported over 50 people home (saving at least 2.2bed days/pt)
- ✓ The CCDHB 'Celebrating Our Success Awards' included a number of ICC related initiatives including: Kapiti Community Acute Response Service winning the HQSC Open Leadership award and the Integration of Youth Services for Porirua (#YouthQuake) was nominated for being a Champion for Collaboration and Integration.
- ✓ The new co-leads for the ICC Health of Older Person Steering Group Kate Scott and Kirsty Lennon have been confirmed and planning for the first meeting in 2020 is underway. They will join the ICC ALT in 2020.
- √ 768 POAC interventions completed in the year from December 2018 –
 November 2019 in CCDHB and an additional 162 Minor gynae. Clexane claims now minimal. 13 ACP Claims over this time period.
- √ 467 HealthPathways and >1.8m page cumulative views since launch.

 Compared to the same period last year (1 Oct 30 Nov), growth in 2019 there has been 20% users and 6.9% page views.

- ✓ There are 106,799 patients registered and 95,439 patients activated to access the MMH portal.
- ✓ With a focus on fragility fractures: Sept to Oct 2019 179 people have received in-home strength & balance; 1453 have received community strength & balance since 2017; and 12 claims for the fragility fracture protocol.
- ✓ The Community Health of Older People initiative, even as a partial team, over a 6wk period carried out 20 case conferences/phone clinics and 13 home visits. The 2nd CHOPI Nurse Practitioner has been recruited to which completes the team.
- ✓ ICT architecture assessment and update benefit assessment of the preferred Ereferral provider has been completed and is due to be discussed with executive leads.
- ✓ 628 CCDHB primary care clinicians have access to Concerto, with another 43awaiting setup by DHB ICT team. Continued work with 3DHB ICT to confirm
 new process for granting access to clinicians and one community pharmacy (as
 prototype) given access to concerto.
- ✓ The Allied Health WoW was formally released on International Allied Health Professionals Day (14 October).
- ✓ The 2019/20 System Level Measure Dashboard has been completed
- ✓ The Diabetes Clinical Network endorsed the Integrated Primary/Secondary Management of the Diabetic Foot model of care
- ✓ An inaugural agenda for 2020 was drafted and circulated to Child Health co-Chairs and other key stakeholders for comment.
