**Summary Highlights for August – September 2019**

<p><b>Notable achievements        August - September</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ HCH Year 3 reflection document developed and published. It highlights the reduction in ED presentation rates for Māori, Pacific and other populations.</li> <li>✓ The preferred provider for the HCH overall evaluation has been selected. The evaluation for the Māori and Pacific world views is yet to be landed.</li> <li>✓ Ten additional HCH practices achieved HCH Certification. CCDHB have the highest number of HCH practices with national HCH Certification.</li> <li>✓ HCH Community Services Integration Celebration events held in Wellington, Kenepuru and Kapiti to thank District Nurses and Allied Health teams for the partnership in the initiative with primary care. There are CSI MDTs established in all HCH practices.</li> <li>✓ The #YouthQuake panel successful presented at Health System Committee and the final report and recommendations for an integrated model of care has been endorsed by HSC.</li> <li>✓ The Kapiti Community Acute Response Service (CARS) has re-directed &gt;100 people back to the community who would otherwise been transported to ED via ambulance</li> <li>✓ Child Health of Older Person Initiative (CHOPI) delivered in two HCH practices with the establishment of case collaboration and phone clinics. A NP has been recruited to and once established will be able to deliver acute geriatric assessments.</li> <li>✓ SLM 2019/20 Partner’s meeting held to complete quarter 1 planning and initiative delivery of activities. The updated SLM dashboard is under development.</li> <li>✓ 597 CCDHB primary care clinicians (including pilot practices) have access to Concerto, with another 62 awaiting setup</li> <li>✓ 45 CCDHB General Practices setup (41 on MMH and 4 on MyIndici). There are 104,808 patients registered and 93,114 patients activated to access the MMH portal (16th September 2019). Testing of indici virtual consultation tool</li> <li>✓ 706 POAC interventions completed in the year from September 2018 – August 2019 in CCDHB and an additional 175 Minor gynae.</li> <li>✓ Our 2018/19 focus on young Māori and Pacific peoples with a diagnosis of diabetes has successfully increased the number of Māori young people with an HbA1c ≤64 mmol by 4% at the end of quarter 4. We did not have the same success for Pacific peoples so this group is our focus for 2019/20</li> </ul>
