


## Fionnagh Dougan biography

Fionnagh Dougan is currently the Chief Executive of the Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Service, a role she has held since January 2015, and is an Adjunct Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Queensland.

As Chief Executive Fionnagh has built a strong, united culture and established an aspirational vision and value set for the new organisation. This has been fundamental to the development of Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Service and transformed it into a top-performing and highly-regarded organisation.

The Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Service now has a system leadership role in supporting the other 15 general Hospital and Health Services across the state.

Starting her career as a nurse, she has postgraduate qualifications in health management, an honours degree in communication, and has held dual registration and experience as both a mental health and a general nurse.



Prior to her tenure in Queensland, Fionnagh was Director of Provider Services at Auckland DHB. In this role she had overarching responsibility for all hospital, clinical support and community services – including paediatric and mental health services.

Her other leadership roles at Auckland DHB include Director of Mental Health and Ambulatory Health Services, Director Cardiovascular and Mental Health Service Groups, and General Manager of Starship Children's Hospital.

Fionnagh is the current President of Children's Hospitals Australasia, a Member of the Health Roundtable, and a Member of the International Children's Hospitals Executive.
