PDRP Matters

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The Professional Development Recognition Programme (PDRP)

The PDRP is a competency based clinical programme that supports the practice development and career progression of enrolled and registered nurses.

PDRP and Scholarship Funding

Having a current PDRP is one requirement for accessing the PDRP and Scholarship Funding.

The PDRP must be current at the time of application, or the funding application will be declined.

Two hour PDRP workshops at Competent, Proficient, Expert & Senior Expert, and Senior level are available for booking via <u>Connect Me</u>.

Competency 2.2 Proficient Level

Undertakes a comprehensive and accurate nursing assessment of health consumers in a variety of settings.

Describe a comprehensive and accurate assessment you completed that required a combination of direct health consumer assessment and physiological or other clinical parameters that demonstrates advanced clinical judgement.

- Give a specific example of a comprehensive and accurate assessment you completed to demonstrate your advanced clinical judgement.
- Make sure you are describing a specific assessment you completed, rather than describing your assessments in general terms.

Few things that you will find helpful in starting and completing your PDRP:

- For full information regarding the PDRP please refer to the PDRP Handbook for RNs and ENs or PDRP Handbook for senior nurses.
- Where to start: have a conversation with your line manager first. The line manager must endorse your PDRP application and determine the appropriate level with you.
- Please see the intranet to view all PDRP portfolio contents and PDRP templates to use.
- There are PDRP workshops available for all PDRP Levels. Please come along these sessions are helpful in assisting you in completing your self-assessment and meeting portfolio requirements.
- CNEs and CNS (MHAIDs) can guide you with your PDRP. The Nurse Coordinator for Professional Development is also available to be contacted for assistance if needed.
- Please note it is an expectation for all CCDHB nurses to be on the PDRP.

Transfer of PDRP

The transfer of PDRP is required for nurses who are new to the organisation (external transfers) or who are existing employees transferring to a new role within the organisation (internal transfers).

For nurses in the primary sector, the new employing organisation must have a PDRP Agreement (MOU) with the DHB
