Competency 2.4

2.4 Ensures the client has adequate explanation of the effects, consequences and alternatives of proposed treatment options.

Describe how you ensure your patient has adequate explanation of the effects, consequences and alternatives of your interventions.

Informed consent is a process rather than a one-off event. The essential elements of this process are effective communication, full information, and freely given, competent consent. How do you apply these elements to your patient care?

This competency is about informed consent.

Examples of interventions can include: medication, urinary catheterisation, IV cannulation, surgical procedures, other investigations/procedures, referrals to other services etc.

Use a specific example from your practice where you ensured that a patient/resident/client had adequate explanation of an intervention.

What did you do to ensure they had adequate information?

What effects, consequences AND alternatives of the intervention did you discuss with them?
